# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I present my President's Report this year for the Goldfields Women's Health Care Centre.

Firstly, on behalf of the Board, we would like to thank the staff of the Centre: Gloria, Carmen, Amy, Marli, Kate, Maria, Jill and Libby – along with Nicole and Veronica - who have worked tirelessly to support this great community organisation during the past financial year.

Until March 2020, we had a relatively smooth time in the Centre. The programs and services were all supported, and we were planning to bring more on stream.

On March 8th, we held a very successful International Women's Day function in the Marquee at the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Race Course. Over 230 ladies and a couple of men enjoyed an afternoon of amazing speakers from Melbourne, Perth and Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

We were blessed to hear so many unique and inspiring stories and the event was ably emceed, yet again, by our wonderful CEO, Gloria, with music from K2. A bonus this year was having the event officially opened by the Hon. Alannah MacTeirnan MLC, who touched on her journey through breast cancer: a topic so close to many women in the Goldfields.

International Women's Day – done and dusted! .....and then we entered a situation which turned everyone's lives around the world, upside down.

I believe that our function was one of the last events attended by so many people, before we entered the lockdown period.

By the middle of March, the COVID-19 pandemic was beginning to take hold of Countries, worldwide. Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the Goldfields entered its own period of lockdown and isolation.

However, I am so proud to report that through it all, the Goldfields Women's Health Care Centre remained open, albeit, through slightly reduced hours. Of course, groups, classes and programs were cancelled, but our staff were kept employed and counselling sessions were still undertaken.

Board meetings continued through Zoom and we all managed to make important decisions, through the major part of the crisis. One important task completed during this time was the development of our new Strategic and Operational Plan 2020-2023. If you haven't had a chance to take a look, I encourage you to see what the Goldfields Women's Health Care Centre is planning for the next three years.

Our CEO has been very busy developing Tenders this year. The partnerships with local groups to build the consortiums is a credit to our local community organisations. The Centre exists on a very small budget and does extraordinary work through the Goldfields. Fundraising is an important part of the work that the staff and Board undertake on a regular basis. I'd like to express my thanks and appreciation to every one of this special group of ladies that go over and above, every month, to contribute to the Centre.

When I presented my Report last year, Gloria and I were continuously lobbying for our own Goldfields Wellness Clinic to provide a doctor onsite for our clients. We have had a small win. Since February, a doctor has been at the Centre, monthly. We are, however, hopeful that this will develop into a long term clinic in 2021.

I'd like to send my appreciate to my Board. They work tirelessly for this community, volunteering their time. Thanks for your support, laughter (and food).

I would like to pay particular mention to Samantha Duddy who is standing down from the Board and her position as Treasuer - a role she has held magnificently for 7 years. Your contribution to the Goldfields Women's Health Care Centre has been amazing and you'll be greatly missed.

I cannot close my report without paying homage to the CEO, Gloria Moyle. Gloria works tirelessly for this organisation, and is always available no matter what time of the day or night she is required. COVID added such an enormous extra pressure on her and the staff; but her true spirit she took it all in her stride and battled through with her usual humour and resilience. # **CEO'S REPORT**

It is with great privilege I present my CEO report on what I can only say has been an exceptional year for all of us.

We finished 2019 on a high looking forward with anticipation of what 2020 would bring us, our staff structure already began to change with the retirement of our long serving Finance Officer Maria Marchegiani.

The New Year brought us a newly developed role of Client Services Officer; Libby Carmody joined us in February bringing her local knowledge, deep spiritual and cultural values.

In March we revamped our signature International Women's Day event, hosting a more informal high tea with National identity Yvie Jones, Perth Based Lana Hill and a swag of our home grown heroes who shared their journey though laughter and tears. The 250 women that attended thoroughly enjoyed the day ,which became the last major event in Kalgoorlie-Boulder due to the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak in the next week.

The immediate effects of COVID-19 on the GWHCC was that all of our GWHCC staff in the high-risk category began to work from home. This was because the health and wellbeing of our greatest assets are our number one priority.

We altered the provision of services to suit the new normality of society; however, we were determined to support our clients with complex needs, particularly during such uncertain times. Our counsellors and I were the only staff left on site to conduct face-to-face appointments with the most stringent of physical distancing and cleaning regimes.

This need became greater over the course of the pandemic, due to our organisation being one of only ones able to provide our invaluable services to homeless and community members experiencing family and domestic violence because of the home isolation. The GWHCC worked tirelessly to make certain that we could continue our advocacy and support, during an extremely challenging time.

In July, Office Coordinator Carmen Tieri, retired from her role after 9 years of service, Carmen was inducted as a Life Member for her long-term commitment to Womens health in the Goldfields.

Determined to ensure that our centre truly represented the demographic and representation of women in our region, we employed 18 year old Amy Astill as the Operations Coordinator to give us a youth perspective, ensuring our services are more appealing to young people in the region.

Marli Heke returned to us as in August as our in house Counsellor, Marli has a wealth of knowledge in the counselling space and a genuine empathy that makes her a wonderful addition to the team.

The GWHCC has looked critically at our organisational structure and infrastructure requirements and our new organisation structure and systems will not only assist GWHCC and support the outstanding work that we do but also to measure our social impact and report more efficiently on our client outcomes

One thing that has not changed this year is GWHCC's commitment to quality service provision with re- accreditation to Australian Excellence in Customer Service Quality Improvement Program. We have actively pursued out new business opportunities and continue to collaborate with many of the Goldfields major stakeholders.

Upon the easing of the COVID19 restrictions, the GWHCC team reassured the community with its presence and engagement at Boulder Market Days, Lorna Mitchel Spring Festival, and the Coffee & Cars events. The aim of our continual presence at forums that influence recovery and events promotes the GWHCC's commitment in rebuilding of the community sector in the Goldfields.

Upon reflection, of what has been a roller coaster of a year, we can also be very proud of the leadership of our Board and adaptability of the staff. We have ensured that our members and women of the Goldfields were provided valued services to support themselves and their families by improving their health and well-being.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

# For Year Ended 30 June 2020

The Centre has reported a surplus of \$77,159 for the financial year. It is abnormal for us to report such a large surplus, and it has come about from a combination of events: staff changes during the year followed by reduced operating hours at the centre that were a response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic has particularly hampered our ability to provide the level of service that we pride ourselves on, but we had to prioritise the safety of our staff and members.

Our government funding and membership fees are consistent with the previous year. The holistic heath programs run in conjunction with external provides remained popular, but we were unable to run classes for an extended period because of COVID restrictions on gathering sizes. The main increase in our income has been through donations, subsidies and grants which are due to the fantastic efforts of the CEO and Chairperson in promoting the organisation.

While our income increased by \$52,671 from the previous year, our expenses also went down by \$45,041. Simply put, with the centre closed and staff working from home, our operating expenses went down. Our program expenses also decreased, as we could not run our usual programs.

One expenses that has increased is bookkeeping fees. This was a result of staff changes at the centre, and the decision was made to outsource our financial processing to Business Precision. As they already prepare our activity statements and Board Financial Reports, it made sense to streamline that service, and meant that we could focus our remaining staff on more client-service roles.

Our cash balances have increased from \$115,965 to \$191,508 at 30 June 2020. Our ratio of current assets to current liabilities (excluding provision for asset replacements) is 3.40:1. This means that we have sufficient cash and current assets to pay our debts.


Overall, it has been a turbulent year for the centre. We lost some long-term staff members for various reasons, and it was sad to see them leave. We were also excited with our new team members, and I hope that they enjoy their positions and that we as a Board are able to support their career development.

I have no doubt that the demand for our services will be skyrocketing through the next year as we continue to deal with the economic, mental and emotional consequences of the pandemic. Once again, I must thank the staff and CEO for all their efforts during the year, and my fellow Board members who all adapted to Zoom meetings and uncertain times with aplomb.
